Economic Impact (2012)

National University of Natural Medicine commissioned ECONorthwest to measure the economic impacts of NUNM's activities on the three-county Portland metropolitan area.

The report's findings: NUNM had a \$55.8 million impact on Portland's economy in 2011 and generated 613 jobs. In addition, the study estimates that every \$1 million the college spends generates an additional \$1.2 million in spending by others.
